

Minutes of the Regular Bradford Township Meeting  
7:00 p.m. Monday September 14, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Richard Hansen. Present were Richard Hansen, John Hass, Bryan Hathaway, Tom Anderson, Justin Anderson, Gary Larson, Greg Anderson, Josh Clemens, and Ron Brockamp. All rose and pledged allegiance to the flag.

The minutes of last month's meeting were read and approved. The motion was made by Bryan Hathaway and seconded by John Hass.

Josh Clemens was present to respond to a letter sent to him to remove a gate on the driveway entering township property. Since the letter was sent and received, supervisor John Hass and Mr. Clemens determined the driveway is on the Clemens property. He thus does not have to remove the gate. However, it was determined that two structures Mr. Clemens has erected are on township property. This is verified by surveyed monument markers. John Hass and Mr. Clemens both agreed to this determination. There was much discussion as to how to handle this situation. He has approximately 14 head of young cattle to feed to market weight and he was going to use these structures to shelter them this winter. Because of this John Hass moved to allow Mr. Clemens until June 1, 2021 to remove the structures from township property. Bryan Hathaway seconded, and the motion passed on a vote of two to one. Mr. Clemens asked if the township would lease him the property. The answer was no.

Justin Anderson reported on roads. He stated that Raven Street should be resurfaced. The cost would be about \$51,000.00. Bryan Hathaway moved to resurface Raven Street from County Road 5 to Quinn. Richard Hansen seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. He has cleaned up several downed trees after the strong winds last week. There was minimal damage to Tamarack after the garbage truck roll over.

Isanti County Commissioner, Greg Anderson, reported on Covid-19 and the relief grant program, zoning and planning, the 2021 county budget, union negotiations, animals at Bradford Estates, and rural broadband.

Tom Anderson presented the Treasurer's report. The motion to approve and pay the bills was made by John Hass and seconded by Bryan Hathaway. The motion passed unanimously.

There was discussion of the Whitetail building lease and electric repair and garage door repair.

The town board is invited to the flag raising for the Veterans Memorial in Cambridge on October 9, 2020.

The campers on Lake Francis appear to be legal if they are only occupied from May 1 to October 31 because the property they are on is in the shoreland district. Does the township need an ordinance for that and for parking on township roads?

There will be no clean-up day this fall.

We adjourned at 9:00 p.m. The motion was made by John Hass and seconded by Bryan Hathaway.
